Drug Take Back Day

Mary Lew Boyce and Donna Pifer once again represented Mon Health during National Drug Take Back Day, collecting expired and unwanted medications at the Mon Health Medical Center main entrance. Additional drop-off locations were available at The Village at Heritage Point and Suncrest Kroger, helping make safe disposal accessible across the communityThey were joined by Seth Figueroa of the Monongalia County Sheriff's Department, who ensured safe handling and transport of collected medications.

This spring, more than 620,000 pounds of medications were collected nationwide, according to the DEA website. Mon Health has proudly participated in this event for over five years, hosting collections twice annually; the fourth Saturday of April and October. "We're seeing more and more community members take advantage of this opportunity to safely dispose of medications," said Donna Pifer.

Why It Matters:

Proper disposal helps prevent accidental poisoning, drug misuse, and environmental contamination—and removes medications from homes before they can fall into the wrong hands.
