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
# **Supporting Cancer Care**

## **ANGEL FUND**

In 2024, we supported nearly 500 oncology patients, who have expressed tremendous appreciation. We provided gas cards and other transportation costs, meal tickets, medications, and hotel stays. In addition, our Wig and Bra Bank had 138 visits, where one young girl with total hair loss was able to find a wig for her senior prom.



## DOVE FUND

The Dove Fund at Preston Memorial Hospital Foundation, supports cancer patients in financial distress by covering prescription co-pays, gas, and even groceries. Funded through local donations, it is a testament to the compassion and generosity of our community, offers tangible results by alleviating financial worries, and allows patients to concentrate on what truly matters: their health and well-being.



## **PINK FUND**

The Pink Fund provides free mammograms for our Preston patients without insurance. In October, Central Preston Middle School and South Preston School volleyball teams raised \$1,195 to support women though the fund. Each year, high school and middle school sports teams throughout Preston County host Pink Out games to promote awareness of breast cancer and the importance of screenings.

### MON PATHWAYS TO SUCCESS

This comprehensive program empowers those who have difficulty re-entering the workforce and prepares adults for successful lives through employment and educational opportunities within the Mon Health System. This program, founded in February 2023, has proven instrumental in fostering personal and professional growth among the participants. Mon Pathways to Success was initially supported by the Hazel Ruby McQuain Charitable Trust and additionally funded by the Appalachian Regional Commission.

Mon Pathways to Success graduated 5 employees from its 4th cohort in November.

# **Supporting Nurses**

### MINDFULNESS BASED RESILIENCY FOR NURSES

The Mindfulness Based Resiliency Program, or MBRN, addresses two primary concerns of nursing in today's climate. In the wake of the Covid pandemic, the burnout rate of nurses reached as high as 70%. Nurses have struggled with increased rates of stress, anxiety, depression and PTSD. Studies have demonstrated a staggering rate of up to 65% of new nursing graduates leaving the profession in the first year. MBRN targets newly hired nurses who are transitioning to hospital nursing and develops a more resilient and sustainable nursing workforce.

The MBRN Program, currently funded by grants from the CareSource Foundation and ENCOVA Foundation, is spearheaded by Kathy Kerzak, Chaplain at Mon Health Medical Center, and has made a significant difference in the lives of our nurses. Led by Dr. Nancy Taylor, MBRN teaches participants coping mechanisms and other mental health skills to combat the often stressful career of nursing.

# Supporting Mothers

### MOODY HEALTH INTEGRATED INTO P3 PROGRAM

Moodr Health is a secure messaging platform that supports perinatal wellness by encouraging patients to regularly share how they're feeling emotionally, mentally, and socially. Designed to prevent, identify, and treat conditions like anxiety, depression, and mood disorders, Moodr allows clinicians access to real-time insights so they can be proactive and personalize care for each patient. With outreach starting at the first pregnancy appointment and continuing through the first year after birth, clinicians can intervene before issues escalate, resulting in fewer hospitalizations and improved long-term health outcomes.

Since implementing Moodr Health in the P3 program, the impact has been substantial with a 43% improvement in mood and anxiety disorder scores.

# **Supporting Women**



### HOPE GAS PARTNERS WITH MON AND DAVIS

Stonewall Jackson Memorial Hospital and the Lewis County Community Educational Outreach Service (CEOS) Clubs joined together on October 9th to host the 30th Annual Breast Cancer Awareness Luncheon, encouraging women in the community to learn about the importance of early detection for breast cancer. Breast cancer survivor Jamie Clem Breen spoke on her experiences stating, "I want to inspire with the hope of health and wellness for my friends, family, and community. People must remain vigilant and receive their yearly screenings and recommended follow-up visits. Early detection saves lives."

Mon Health Medical Center's inaugural Mammos & Massages series included two special days dedicated to breast cancer awareness and self-care. After their annual mammograms, attendees enjoyed some delicious charcuterie from Baker Cheese, and indulged in relaxing massages provided by Triquetra Body, creating the perfect blend of health, wellness, and community support.

# **Supporting Education**



The "Mary Virginia" traveled across West Virginia throughout 2024, providing labs and simulations for Mon Health Staff and WVJC nursing students and attending community events to educate the public. Designed to expand access to nursing education, the mobile training lab provides students and staff the opportunity to learn and practice in realistic situations. This innovation was made possible by the continued support of Ron and Stephanie Stovash, The Health Plan, the Hazel Ruby McQuain Trust, and the generosity of our community.







Simulation labs are now commonly used to train nurses and other healthcare professionals, but it is often cost-prohibitive and affixed to one location. This innovative model makes simulation training mobile, expanding its access beyond a single location. For Mon Health, this collaboration with WVJC provides simulation training for its current workforce at healthcare facilities throughout North Central West Virginia.

# Supporting Preston



### FIRST NIGHT OUT

Preston Memorial Hospital Foundation hosted another successful First Night Out on March 23rd, despite being postponed due to January snow! Guests all chose a different theme for their tables, ranging from baseball to tropical, and participated in raffles, auctions, and karaoke throughout the evening. The event raised nearly \$10,000 for cancer care in Preston County.



## CANCER CENTER RINGS FIRST BELL

The Cancer Care Team at Preston Memorial Hospital celebrated the graduation of its first patient and the first ringing of the newly installed bell. The plaque which holds the bell was designed and crafted by our Mon Health family members, Brian Steffke and Roxanna and Curtis Stiles. The Cancer Center, which opened in October, provides chemotherapy, lab services, and other oncology treatment, keeping cancer care close to home.

# **Expanding Preston**

Vandalia Health's Mon Health Preston Memorial Hospital has been awarded \$1.5 million through the West Virginia Rural Hospital Grant Program. The funding will enable the expansion of existing facilities to create additional patient care areas, further enhancing the quality of care provided to the Kingwood community and surrounding areas.

"We are deeply grateful to Governor Jim Justice and the state of West Virginia for this generous investment in rural health care and our hospital," said Melissa Lockwood, Chief Administrative Officer of Mon Health Preston Memorial Hospital. "This grant will significantly enhance our ability to serve our patients and meet the growing health care needs of our community."

The planned 6,000-square-foot expansion will feature a dedicated entrance for oncology and infusion patients to enhance infection prevention measures and provide a more private experience. The space will include eight infusion bays, three exam rooms, and additional clinical areas tailored to the needs of oncology patients. The expansion will also provide additional square footage for providers and support staff as well as shell space for future growth.

The \$1.5 million grant is part of a broader \$40 million distribution aimed at improving health care infrastructure and services at rural hospitals across West Virginia. The Rural Hospital Grant Program, launched in October, follows the appropriation of funds by the West Virginia Legislature during its most recent special session. The program is designed to address critical health care needs in rural communities by investing in the facilities and services that ensure residents have access to high-quality care close to home.



# **Enhancing Infusion Therapy**

Sitting in heated, massage chairs isn't just for the spa. Vandalia Health, in partnership with the Norma Mae Huggins Cancer Endowment, utilized the proceeds from the 2024 Bob Huggins Fish Fry to ensure our infusion patients are the most comfortable they can be during treatment. Patients were expressing discomfort with the aging infusion recliners, as treatment requires them to sit in for several hours.

A total of 44 recliners were recently delivered to Stonewall Jackson Memorial Hospital Infusion Center, Mon Health Medical Center Infusion Center, Davis Medical Center Cancer Care Center, and CAMC Cancer Center-Beckley, providing infusion patients with a more comforting experience.





### VANDALIA NORTH INNOVATOR AWARD

This award recognizes, celebrates and rewards innovative thinking and development of clinicians. It is designed to foster advanced care, technologies and modalities to improve patient care, quality and outcomes.



The list of Dr. Wissam Gharib's achievements is long. He has led the development of the most advanced techniques to treat and diagnose structural heart illness and deformities. He is an international leader in Watchmen, a device to help reduce atrial fibrillation. He launched the mitral valve clip, performed the first cases of renal denervation in our region, and continues to advance minimally invasive cardiology procedures. Dr. Gharib's efforts are a major part of why our heart and vascular team has been recognized as the best in the state by the American College of Cardiology and US News and World Report.

Dr. Tom McClellan holds more than 60 patents for medical devices and technology. He created Intermed Labs, the state's first clinician led medical device studio, providing fellow innovators with a channel to share ideas, test viability and develop medical devices, bringing benefits to patients and providers. Dr. McClellan's efforts have produced many concepts that are benefiting patients world-wide.

Through the vision and leadership of Dr. Jaschar Shakuri-Rad, we have seen great advancement in robotic and minimally invasive surgery. He has developed medical devices and identified technologies and techniques to ensure the best urological care possible for our state. Dr. Shakuri-Rad is world renowned, training providers in Europe on advanced urological approaches.
